RACING AND SAILING RULES

Race participants are encouraged to download and read Sail Training International's *Racing and Sailing Rules and Special Regulations*. These are available to download from the ASTA website on the 2010 TALL SHIPS CHALLENGE® page.

DRAFT COURSES

The courses listed below are subject to change. Confirmation of the courses to be sailed will be given during the Captain's Briefing in each race start port. Sailing instructions for each race and race entry forms will be available on the ASTA website (www.sailtraining.org) and on the TALL SHIPS CHALLENGE® blog (www.tallshipschallenge.wordpress.com) prior to the start of the race series.



Race One: Cleveland to west end of Lake Erie

Race Two: Bay City to north end of Lake Huron

Race Three: Duluth to east end of Lake Superior, outside Sault Ste Marie locks

Race Four: Green Bay to south end of Lake Michigan, outside Chicago

TIME CORRECTION FACTORS

Each registered vessel will be issued a rating certificate which will be calculated by Sail Training International's Rule of Rating that ensures that all vessels will be able to race equally on corrected time. All new vessels will be provided with a measurement form which will need to be completed in advance which will also be available for download.

For safety reasons, and to maintain the public's interest in the races, ASTA will organize daily radio schedules. Vessels' positions will be radioed to the designated communication vessel

which will then transmit them to the ASTA office where the positions will be updated online on various websites.

CREW MANIFESTS

ASTA will be requiring that all vessel operators and captains/masters fill out a crew manifest in each port prior to the race starts. The form will be available to download from the ASTA website on the 2010 TALL SHIPS CHALLENGE® page and from the TALL SHIPS CHALLENGE® blog, as well as at the pre-race Captain's briefing distributed by a member of the ASTA Race Team.

PASSPORT AND VISA REQUIREMENTS

USA

As of January 2008, all foreign nationals arriving in the U.S. by sea or air will be required to have a valid passport. As a general rule, the passport should be valid for 6 months beyond the expected date of departure from the U.S. In addition, all foreign nationals will be required to obtain a B1/B2 visa. Canadian and Bermudian citizens do not require a visa to enter the U.S. Participants in this event should be aware that the visa waiver program allowing nationals of participating countries to enter the U.S. for 90 days without a visa cannot be utilized by persons arriving in the U.S. on carriers that are not signatories to the VWP (Visa Waiver Program) agreement. **Tall Ships and other non-commercial vessels are rarely signatories to the agreement**, and therefore crew must obtain B1/B2 visas. B1/B2 visas are non-immigrant visas for business or pleasure.

Permanent, full time, professional crew members must have a valid C1/ D visa but they are reminded that they may only stay in U.S. waters for 29 days.

U.S. citizens will need passports to re-enter the U.S. from Canada by sea. Legal Permanent Residents should have their "green cards."

CANADA

Foreign nationals who are seeking to enter Canada must be in possession of a passport and, in certain cases, a temporary resident visa (TRV). Foreign nationals arriving in Canada as crew members of a vessel who hold a seafarer's identity document issued under International Labor Organization (ILO) conventions do not require a passport. They do require a passport, however, if travelling to Canada by air or by other means for the purpose of becoming a member of the crew of a vessel which is already in Canada.

Foreign nationals do not require a TRV if they are carried to Canada by a vessel of which they are crew members and are seeking to enter Canada as a crew member of that vessel and to remain in Canada solely as a crew member of that vessel or any other vessel. They do require a visa, however, if they are seeking to enter Canada to join a vessel as a crew member and are citizens of a country whose citizens require a TRV. For an up to date list on the countries that require TRVs to enter Canada, please refer to the Citizenship and Immigration Canada at www.cic.gc.ca/english/index.asp .

Foreign nationals working as crew members of ships in Canada do not require a work permit provided that the ship on which they are employed, or are to join, is of foreign registry and is engaged in international transportation or other activities. Crew members may not work aboard vessels which require coasting trade licenses or perform dockside functions, such as the loading or unloading of cargo, without a work permit.

TRANSPORTATION WORKERS ID CARD ("TWIC")

What is TWIC? TWIC is a common identification credential for all personnel requiring unescorted access to secure areas of MTSA-regulated facilities and vessels, and all mariners holding Coast Guard-issued credentials. Individuals who meet TWIC eligibility requirements will be issued a tamper-resistant credential containing the worker's biometric (fingerprint template) which allows for a positive link between the card and the individual.

Who must get a TWIC? We anticipate that over 1.2 million individuals will apply for a TWIC. This includes Coast Guard-credentialed merchant mariners, port facility employees, long shore workers, truck drivers, and others requiring unescorted access to secure areas of maritime facilities and vessels regulated by MTSA.

What are the eligibility requirements for a TWIC?

An individual must be a U.S. citizen or fall into an eligible immigration category (click here for immigration categories) and can not have been convicted of certain crimes. In addition, individuals cannot be connected to terrorist activity or lack mental capacity.

Are individuals who work on cruise ships required to get a TWIC? Most cruise ships that call on U.S. ports are foreign flagged and do not have secure areas as defined by MTSAs, therefore individuals working on those ships would not require a TWIC. For U.S. flagged cruise ships, if an individual requires unescorted access to areas designated as 'secure' or 'restricted', a TWIC is required. If the individual only requires access to 'passenger access' areas, a TWIC is not required.
